Street Photography Tips

Before You Start

Look at photographs by famous street photographers. Here's a good source:

- 1. Have your camera ready to avoid missed opportunities. Things move quickly on the streets.
- 2. Use a wide-angle lens
- 3. Use Aperture Priority. Start with f/16 and an ISO of 200. Then check to see that your shutter speed is higher than 1/200s. If it isn't, adjust aperture and ISO. In street photography you don't have time to continually change your settings.
- 4. Experiment blur your subject; get close; try different angles and compositions. Street photography is a less formal type of photography. This is the time to break the "rules."
- 5. Use back-button focus.
- 6. Try shooting from the hip. It allows you to be unobtrusive when you're photographing strangers in public.
- 7. Slow down. Look at the background and wait for someone to walk by.
- 8. Simplify and pay attention to details. Look for the little things that other people miss.
